Imperative conjugation of "Incomplete" Verbs

Recall: An "incomplete" verb [فِعْلٌ نَاقِصٌ] is a verb that ends with a vowel (i.e. "ا", "ى", or "و").

اِسْتَدْعِ	اِسْتَدْعِي	اِسْتَدْعِيَا	اِسْتَدْعُوا	اِسْتَدْعُونَّ
يَسْتَدْعِي				
				to call for to send for

Drill: conjugate as above the following verbs:

- (i) يَلْقَى (to meet) (ii) يَمْشِي (to walk)
- (iii) يَحْبُو (to crawl) (to fulfill)
to satisfy (condition)
- (iv) يَسْتَوْفِي (to fulfill or satisfy conditions)
